Scenel

- Characters
 - > The 3 witches
- Setting
 - Scotland
- The witches are discussing where and when they will meet again.
- They are going to meet during a storm. After the fighting has stopped. They are going to meet again to meet with Macbeth.
 - Motif-
 - "Fair is foul and foul is fair"
 - Appearance vs. Reality

Scene II

- Characters-
 - > Duncan, Captain, Malcolm, Lennox and Ross.
- Setting
 - Battle field
- Duncan, the king of Scotland, learns about Macbeth's victory in battle.
- Macbeth and Banquo are not in this scene.
- Duncan names Macbeth the new thane of Cawdor.

Scene III

- Characters
 - Witches, Macbeth, Banquo, Ross, and Angus
- Setting
 - A bleak place near the battle field. This is the same location that the witches describe in scene 1.
- This scene begins with the witches talking to one another.
- The witches tell Macbeth that he will be the thane of Cawdor and the king.
- They also tell Banquo that his descendents will be kings even though he is not one.

Scene 4

- Setting
 - Battle Field
- Duncan makes Macbeth the Thane of Cawdor.
- This is when Macbeth begins to believe the witches prophecy.

Scene 5

- Setting
 - Macbeth's Castle
- Opens with Lady Macbeth reading a letter from Macbeth. In this letter she learns about the witches prophecies. He tells he how part of the prophecy has come true.
- Lady Macbeth does not believe that Macbeth has the courage to kill Duncan.
- When Macbeth gets to the castle, where Lady Macbeth is, she tells him that he must kill Duncan.
- She also tells him that the murder cannot look like his doing.

Scene 6

- Setting
 - Macbeth's castle
- Characters
 - > Duncan, Lady Macbeth and Banquo
- They are awaiting Macbeth's arrival.
 Duncan is explaining how Lady Macbeth is a wonderful hostess.

- Setting
 - > A room in Macbeth's Castle
- Characters
 - Macbeth and Lady Macbeth
- Macbeth is having second thoughts about killing Duncan. Lady Macbeth finds him and accuses him of being a coward.
- Lady Macbeth explains that she will make sure the king's attendants are heavily intoxicated. Then Macbeth can kill Duncan with one of the attendant's weapons.
